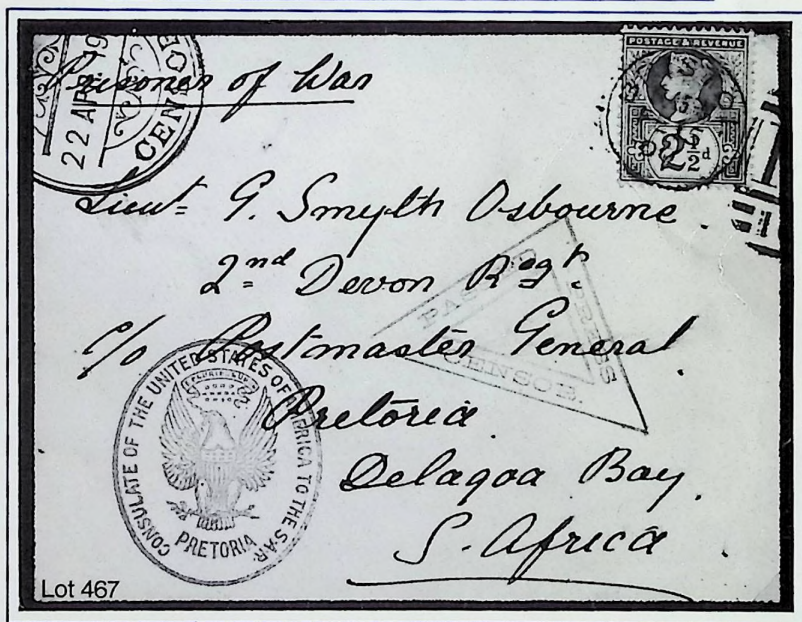

THE PERRIN-FITZHERBERT CORRESPONDENCE

The first 350 lots in this auction comprise the remarkably comprehensive archive of the West Indies correspondence relating to the Jamaican and Barbados estates of the Perrin and Fitzherbert families. The vast majority of the letters are in excellent condition, as are the early West Indian Newspapers.

The earliest recorded handstruck marking of Barbados and the earliest recorded Town-marks of Jamaica are included, along with a whole range of other varieties. Whereas there is considerable duplication of some things — especially the 18th Century JAMAICA and IAMAICA marks — it has been decided to offer the whole archive on one day, so that there can be no worries about further quantities becoming available. Archives such as this **very rarely** come onto the market, and we can assure all collectors that this is the **complete** West Indies correspondence.

And yet even where there is duplication there is still tremendous variety, especially amongst named ships, routes, rates and the fascinating contents of so many of the letters. Having said that, estimates have been set at a modest level, and we are confident that there will be no lots remaining unsold.

The archive has been housed for some years in the care of the Derbyshire Record Office. We have been able to build up an excellent working relationship with the staff there, and in accordance with the vendor's wishes all the material has been microfilmed over the last few months. So the wealth of information contained in these letters will not be lost to students. Indeed the British Library have no record of any other copies of the early West Indies Newspapers that are included, and so these have been specially microfilmed for both institutions.

Pencilled archival numbers have been left on each item, because a detailed record of all the items that have been removed from the County Record Office has been kept. Collectors will have the choice of rubbing these marks off or leaving them on as part of the documents' distinctive history.

To set this correspondence in its historical context, some background notes have been included which add a good deal to one's appreciation of the letters' contents:-

BACKGROUND & HISTORICAL NOTES REF: THE PERRIN - FITZHERBERT CORRESPONDENCE

William Perrin made his fortune as a merchant at Kingston in the first decades of the 18th Century. Probably he acquired most of his plantations through foreclosures of loans; this is why they are scattered about the island.

- 1739 He goes to England, leaving behind Philp, one of his partners, as his attorney.
- 1747 Dissatisfied with Philp, he appoints Fuller and Co. as his attorneys.
- 1749 Philp dies without leaving a will.
- 1759 Perrin dies, apparently without having returned to Jamaica, leaving his fortune to his son William Philp Perrin.

Perrin's career gives a useful illustration of some aspects of Jamaica's early history. The colony was taken by the English in 1655 but for various reasons sugar planting did not become well established there until the 18th century. The island's period of greatest prosperity began with a marked increase in the price of sugar about the middle of the century. At the same time there was stagnation or decline in the contraband trade to the Spanish American colonies which until then had been one of the main activities of the Kingston merchants; it is in this that Perrin had probably made most of his money. So merchants turn from trade to planting, and because of the high price of sugar, planters could afford to leave the colony and live as absentees in England. Absentee ownership was common throughout the British West Indies, particularly in Jamaica, and particularly from the middle of the 18th century. By the 1760s about a third of Jamaican plantations belonged to absentees, and by the 1820s about 80%. Most of the surviving collections of West Indian papers start with this increase in absenteeism round about the 1750s and 1760s.

William Philp Perrin inherited five plantations — Retrieve, Vere, Forrest, Blue Mountain and Grange Hall — with about 600 slaves, yielding about £5000 pa, and worth about £60,000. This was a large fortune even by Jamaican standards. Perrin seems never to have been to the West Indies to see his properties, probably because of his chronic bad health, and perhaps also because of the influence of his mother.

Of the five plantations, Forrest was sold c.1769, probably because it was so widely separated from the others, and Retrieve — a small coffee estate with some uneconomic gold deposits — was rented out. The Perrin-Fitzherbert Papers deal with the three other properties.

VERE

This lay near the sea in the plain of the Rio Minho, to the west of Kingston. (The name Perrins still appears on the modern 1/50,000 map of Jamaica). Methods of sugar planting in this part of the island were distinctive: the soil is fertile and easily worked — sugar is still grown there, while Blue Mountain and Grange Hall have been abandoned to bananas. This meant that the slaves were not worked so hard as on most sugar plantations, and so (very unusually) they were able to maintain their numbers through natural increase, at least by the early 19th century. However, the area was subject to drought, which made yields and profits very variable.

BLUE MOUNTAIN

Before the last years of slavery this was the most valuable of the three plantations. The same conditions that made it such a good place for growing sugar — the heavy soil and the high rainfall — made it a bad place for keeping slaves; deaths persistently exceeded births. This was usual on sugar plantations, but here the rate of depletion was particularly high. The development of the plantation aggravated the difficulty as the growing cane acreage encroached on the slave's provision grounds. In the 1790s Sutherland tried to lighten the labour of the slaves by introducing the plough — a fashionable policy in Jamaica at the time — but it seems to have failed, because there was not enough pasture to support draught animals.

GRANGE HALL

This was the least valuable of the three plantations. It lay at the eastern end of the island in a rather isolated position between mountains and the sea, in a district notorious for its bad husbandry. Its cane land was of poor quality, the mill and boiling house were awkwardly sited, and in wartime local shipping was vulnerable to attack from French and Spanish privateers. In 1825 it was decided to abandon sugar growing there, turn it into a livestock pen, and transfer most of the slaves to Blue Mountain. Sugar production certainly dwindled after this and pasture and livestock were increased.

Profits from the three properties taken together moved roughly as follows:

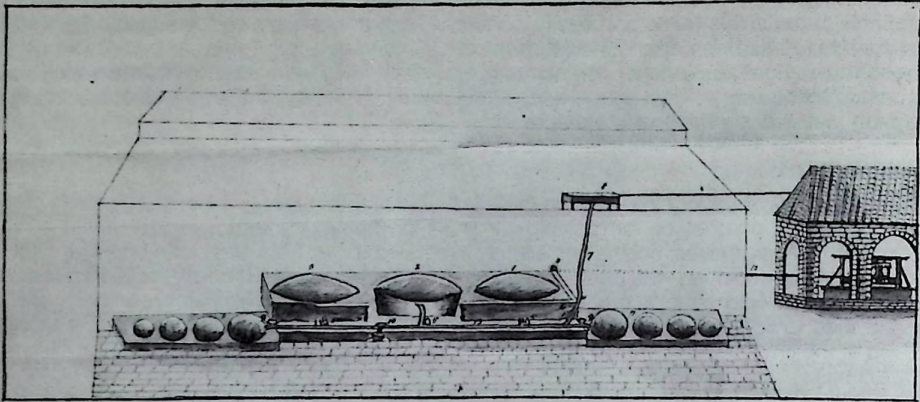
The recovery between 1804 and 1819 was the result of improvements made by Francis Graham. The decline in the 1820s, when Fitzherbert had inherited the Perrin estates, reflects the general difficulties facing all West Indian proprietors at this time rather than any failure of efficiency in management.

The first difficulty was the fall of sugar prices in the 1820s to about half their previous level, mainly because of competition from some highly productive new colonies; — Trinidad, British Guiana, and Mauritius. In 1807 Parliament stopped the African slave trade, and from this time the slave population of the British West Indies began to fall. With a dwindling labour force, production had to be reduced also. One of the most interesting aspects of the collection is the information it gives about how Fitzherbert tried to cope with these difficulties by introducing to Jamaica practices with which he was familiar as the owner of a plantation in Barbados.

TURNER'S HALL, BARBADOS

This plantation was acquired by the Fitzherbert family in the 18th century. It covered 386 acres and was worked by 150-200 slaves. The sugar plantations of Barbados were rather different from those of Jamaica. The island is flatter, more densely settled, and its estates were smaller with much less wood and mountain land. Sugar planting in Barbados fell to a very low ebb in the later 18th century through drought and soil exhaustion, but then the situation was retrieved by a minor revolution in agricultural technique. The estate yielded about £1600 p.a. in the 1770s — about 15% on capital, very good by contemporary Barbados standards. They fall to about £1000 in the 1780s, but recover to about £1600 p.a. by the 1820s — no more than they had been in the 18th century, but with the low sugar prices of the time this represents a considerable improvement in efficiency.

Explanation of the above Plan of Still's Glass fire -

When the Still is first about, the liquor runs in the Gullet 16. and comes into the boiling House at a Station the Still 4. When the panne 3. is full, the liquor is left, and made to run into Still 2. This is now put to. The liquor comes as soon as possible to a boil, when the fire is drawn, and the liquor stands to settle. The Cover 5. of the Still is now opened and the liquor runs into the Coppers 10. 11. and the Still 5. and pipe 10. When all the Clear liquor is run out the panne is cleaned out with a shovel and the Water pipe 7. is closed by the Cock 6. when the water from the Cistern 8. runs up the Still 5. and cleans it and the panne. The Cocks are all stopped and the Water below out - and the 2. panne comes in relation to the same fire to be one filling and the other running off

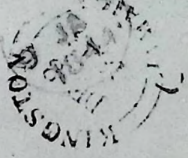

The following 26 lots comprise a unique run of very rare early Jamaican newspapers. In variable but mostly fine condition. (Examples of these papers are not even included in the vast collections of the British Library; the latter now have a microfilm of these actual copies). Almost all of these papers include important details of mail-carrying ships, and many have specific "Post Office" announcements. In addition they are full of fascinating details of life in the islands during the Napoleonic war period, and during the build-up to the abolition of slavery in 1833. It is clear that each one of these papers was sent by post from Jamaica to England at the time; the original 'open-ended' wrappers were thrown away, but traces of their addresses sometimes extended onto the papers themselves and a number of papers have fragmentary RED WAX JAMAICAN BAG SEALS (Lot 344 etc); one (Lot 339) has a "SHIP LETTER/LIVERPOOL" mark.

“Steph” Stobbs (as he is better known to philatelists up and down the country) has been collecting Postal History for over 60 years. His father’s enormous book collections filled the Stobbs family home from cellar to attic, and it seems that collecting came to Steph as naturally as walking. Now well past his 80th year, he has finally decided that he should give other collectors of his three favourite Postal History specialities — the Anglo-Boer War, the County of Shropshire and Freemasonry — a chance to acquire the hundreds of gems that have given him so much pleasure for so long. Many of these covers have been in his collection for well over a quarter of a century. (He began collecting the Postal History of Shropshire in 1928, that of the Boer War in 1953, and that relating to Freemasonry a little more recently).

These three famous collections — all are amongst the most comprehensive of their kind ever to have been formed — will be auctioned by Cavendish over the next few months, along with his extensive Philatelic and Masonic libraries. First to come under the hammer will be the Boer War Collection which has been divided into well over 350 lots, all of which appear in the following pages. One of the great strengths of the Steph Stobbs Boer War Collection is the amount of research that Steph undertook into the history and context of every cover. Everything is mounted on album pages, neatly written up, and where ancillary ephemera or illustrative material could be found it is included.

It has been a great joy to handle and describe this collection, the many parts of which will soon be redistributed throughout the collecting world. It is hoped that the arrangement of lots — based on Steph’s original structure for the collection — will be easy to follow.

Steph sends his greetings to all his friends, who will be glad to hear that he is still an avid reader of all the philatelic magazines at his nursing home near his native Halesowen. They will also be glad to hear that he has an understanding doctor who has recently prescribed daily tots of whisky! Steph is in good hands, and we like to think that his collections are being just as carefully looked after.
