Notice. Harmers of London Stamp Auctioneers Ltd., the auctioneers, exercise all reasonable care to ensure that all statements as to cancellation, centring, colour, condition, date of issue or of postal marking, gum, margins, paper, perforation, printing, provenance, quality, sheet position, status, usage, watermark, etc., in lot descriptions are reliable and accurate, and that each item is genuine unless contrary is indicated. However, the statements are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be, statements of fact or representations of fact in relation to the lot. They are statements of the opinion of the auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 5 below. Comments and opinions, concerning the characteristics mentioned above, which may be found in or on lots as notes, catalogue prices, writing-up or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of lot descriptions and are not to be taken as such unless they are made or specifically verified by the auctioneers.

- 1. (a) Each lot is put up subject to any reserve price imposed by the vendor. (b) Subject to sub-clause (a) of this clause the highest bidder for each lot shall be the purchaser thereof. (c) If any dispute arises as to the highest bidder the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute and may put up again and re-sell the lot in respect of which the dispute arises.
- 2. (a) The bidding and advances shall be regulated by and at the absolute discretion of the auctioneer, and he shall have the right to refuse any bid or bids. NOTE: Where an agent bids, even on behalf of a disclosed client, the auctioneer nevertheless has the right at his discretion to refuse any such bid. (b) The purchaser of each lot shall immediately on its sale if required by the auctioneer give to him the name and address of the purchaser and pay to the auctioneer at his discretion the whole or part of the purchase money. If the purchaser of any lots fails to comply with any such requirement the auctioneer may put up again and re-sell the lot; if upon such re-sale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and expenses of re-sale which shall become a debt due from him. (c) Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed client such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase money to the auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said client.
- 3. (a) The auctioneer reserves the right to bid on behalf of clients and vendors, but shall not be liable for errors or omissions in executing instructions to bid. (b) The auctioneer reserves the right before or during a sale to group together lots belonging to the same vendor, to split up and to withdraw any lot or lots at the auctioneer's absolute discretion and without giving any reason in any case. (c) The auctioneer acts as agent only, and therefore shall not be liable for any default of the purchaser or vendor.
- 4. (a) Each lot shall be at the purchaser's risk from the fall of the hammer and shall be paid for in full before delivery and taken away at his expense by a purchaser in the United Kingdom within seven days from the date of sale, and by a purchaser overseas within fourteen days from the date of sale, or such longer time as shall be agreed in writing between the auctioneer and the purchaser. (b) If any purchaser fails to pay in full for any lot within the time stated in sub-clause (a) of this clause such lot may at any time thereafter at the auctioneer's discretion be put up for asle by auction again or sold privately; if upon such re-sale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and the expenses of re-sale which shall become a debt due from him. (c) Interest at 2% per month shall be payable by the purchaser on any overdue account, but the auctioneer shall have a discretion to waive payment of the interest.
- 5. (a) Each lot is sold as (i) genuine unless otherwise described in the sale catalogue or by the auctioneer; and (ii) correctly described. The date of any certificate forming part of the description of any lot will be included in the description. (b) A purchaser shall be at liberty to reject any lot if he (i) gives the auctioneer written notice of intention to question the genuineness or, as the case may be, the accuracy of description of the lot within seven days (or, in the case of an overseas purchaser, a reasonable time) from the date of sale; AND (ii) proves that the lot is not genuine or was incorrectly described; AND (iii) returns to the auctioneer within 30 days from the date of sale the lot in the same condition as it was at the time of sale; provided that the auctioneer may, at his absolute discretion, on receiving a request in writing from the purchaser, extend for a reasonable period the time for return of the lot to enable it to be submitted to expertisation. NOTE: The onus of proving a lot to be not genuine or incorrectly described is on the purchaser. The inability of a recognised expert or an expert committee to express a definite opinion shall serve to discharge the onus on the purchaser and shall be a ground for rejecting the lot concerned. (c) Where a lot has been submitted to expertisation all costs of such expertisation shall be paid by the person who retains the certificate and item or items to which the certificate relates. (a) Where the purchaser of a lot discharges the onus and acts in accordance with sub-clause (b) of this clause, the auctioneer shall rescind the sale and repay to the purchaser the purchase money paid by him in respect of the lot. (e) No lot shall be rejected if, subsequent to the sale, it has been immersed in water, marked by an expert or expert committee or treated by any other process unless the auctioneer's permission to subject the lot to such immersion, marking or treatment has first been obtained in writing. (f) Any lot listed under "collections and various" or stated to comprise or contain a collection, issues or stamps which are undescribed shall be put up for sale not subject to rejection and shall be taken by the purchaser with all (if any) faults, lack of genuineness and errors of description and numbers of stamps in the lot; and the purchaser shall have no right to reject the lot except that, notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this sub-clause, where before a sale a person intending to bid at the sale gives notice in writing to, and satisfies, the auctioneer that any such lot contains any item or items undescribed in the sale catalogue and that person specifically describes that item or those items in that notice, then that item or items shall, as between the auctioneer and that person, be taken to form part of the description of the lot. THE FORSYTH COLLECTION

by

H. R. Holmes R.D.P., F.R.P.S.L.

W. W. Forsyth, F.R.P.S.L.

Few collectors of the present day will know the name of Forsyth as a force in philately. But between the wars W. W. Forsyth, the founder of the collection now being sold, and father of Robert W. Forsyth, exercised a profound influence on the hobby not only in Scotland but also in England. He was a man of very wide interests in his collecting pursuits, as he was also a notable numismatist, and in his business career he also spread his interests, the firm of which he was head at one time issuing a Scottish cricket annual, from 1889-1960, sets of which are now greatly prized by collectors of cricketana.

Both father and son were Fellows of the Royal Philatelic Society, their combined membership totalling more than seventy years, and at the time of his death R. W. Forsyth was one of the senior members of the Society, having been elected in 1926. Among the displays given by W. W. Forsyth was that of his collection of Niger Coast Provisionals in 1935, and on that occasion he read an important paper on these stamps. He attended some of the inter-war philatelic exhibitions on the Continent, and exhibited some of his stamps. On these visits he was usually accompanied by some of his staff, and one remembers at Hamburg in 1931 the arrival at the social functions of his party all in full evening dress, with the ladies superbly gowned.

In a collection of this magnitude it is not easy to select one part for special mention, where each colony or country has its special appeal, but the collection of the stamps of St. Vincent is of such outstanding quality that attention should be drawn to some of the more notable items. This collection was formed before the last war, and therefore the stamps now being sold have not been on the market for the past forty or fifty years, and it is only when an old and important collection such as this is dispersed that the finest material becomes

available to delight the present-day philatelist.

The pre-stamp covers from St. Vincent, of which there are 16, range from 1788 to 1857, and the majority are letters addressed to Scotland. These should appeal to postal history enthusiasts, as they formed part of an original "find" only now being known to the generality of collectors. The catalogue illustrations of the mint stamps show the quality of the material in the collection, and this is emphasised by the numerous blocks of these attractive stamps, but attention should be drawn to the ever-popular 5s. of 1880, which is included in all its states: die proof, plate proof, colour proof, "Specimen", and three

mint examples. The same value, but printed by De La Rue in 1888, is also represented by a range of proofs, including the rare colour trial in rose-red, the colour of the Perkins, Bacon printing, and two complete sheets. As there are used copies of both printings of this value, the later one on cover, the story of the life of this 5s. can be shown almost "from the cradle to the grave". Among the provisional issues of 1880-81 are three pairs of the 1d. on half 6d. and two singles, several pairs and a block of eight of the $\frac{1}{2}$ d. on half 6d., as well as two pairs each having the variety "fraction bar omitted." Of the other two provisionals, the 1d. on 6d. is represented by two unused and five used, one of the latter being on piece with $\frac{1}{2}$ d. on half 6d., while the 4d. on 1s. vermilion includes one unused among the three copies on offer.

The covers in the collection range from the 1867 issue to 1897, and include some of the Duc de Polignac correspondence, most nineteenth century issues being represented by one or more attractive items. The cancellations include many of the rare datestamps with the name of the post office indicated only by

a two- or three-letter abbreviation.

The collections of some of the other West Indian islands are not so large as that of St. Vincent, but nevertheless each includes some outstanding rarities and notable pieces, and one need only draw attention to the superb blocks of the early stamps of St. Lucia, which are illustrated in colour in the separate catalogue, to emphasise that. St. Christopher is a small country to collect so far as the number of its stamps are concerned, but one with many rarities. Of these the collection has three: "One Penny." on 6d. green with inverted surcharge; "One Penny." on 2½d. ultra-marine with inverted surcharge; and "One Penny." on 6d. with double surcharge. The first of these is known only unused and but one sheet of twenty was surcharged in this manner. Both used and unused exist of the second, of which also only one sheet of twenty was printed, but the example now offered is unique in being used on piece with the "Half-penny" bisect. Fewer than a dozen of the third ever existed as only part of the sheet was doubly surcharged. The "One Penny" on 6d. of Dominica was originally in the Ferrari collection, and is one of the best existing copies of this very rare stamp.

The level at which underwriters require advice of individually valuable items has been raised from £500 to £750.
