

# CONDITIONS OF SALE OF H. R. HARMER LTD., SUBJECT TO WHICH ALL LOTS ARE OFFERED AT THIS AUCTION

Notice. H. R. Harmer Ltd., the auctioneers, exercise great care to ensure that all statements as to cancellation, centring, colour, condition, date of issue or postmark, gum, paper, printing, provenance, quality, sheet position, status, use and watermark, etc., in the lot descriptions are reliable and accurate, and that each item, unless the contrary is indicated, is genuine and authentic. The statements, however, are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be statements of fact or representations of fact. They are statements of the opinion of the auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 6 below.

- The highest bidder for each lot shall be the purchaser thereof. Each lot is put up subject to any reserve price imposed
  by the vendor. If any dispute arises as to the highest bidder the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute
  and may put up again and re-sell the lot in respect of which the dispute arises.
- 2.—(a) The bidding and advances shall be regulated by and at the absolute discretion of the auctioneer, and he shall have the right to refuse any bid or bids. (b) The purchaser of each lot shall immediately on its sale if required by the auctioneers give to them the name and address of the purchaser and pay to them at their discretion the whole or part of the purchase money. If the purchaser of any lot fails to comply with any such requirement the auctioneers may put up again and re-sell the lot; if upon such re-sale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and expenses of resale which shall become a debt due from him. (c) Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed client such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase price to the auctioneers and for safe delivery of the lot to the said client.
- 3.—(a) The auctioneers reserve the right to bid on behalf of clients and vendors, but shall not be liable for errors or omissions in executing instructions to bid. (b) The auctioneers reserve the right before or during a sale to group together any lots belonging to the same vendor, to split up and to withdraw any lot or lots at the auctioneers' absolute discretion and without giving any reason in any case.
- 4.—Each lot shall be at the purchaser's risk from the fall of the hammer and shall be paid for in full before delivery and taken away at his expense by a purchaser in the United Kingdom within seven days of the date of sale and by a purchaser overseas within 14 days or such longer time as shall be agreed in writing between the auctioneers and the purchaser. If any purchaser fails to pay in full for any lot within the said time such lot may at any time thereafter at the auctioneer's discretion be put up for sale by auction again or sold privately; if upon such resale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and the expenses of resale which shall become a debt due from him.
  - 5.—The auctioneers shall act as agents only and shall not be liable for any default of the purchaser or vendor.
- 6.—(a) Each lot shall be put up for sale as exhibited, with all faults and errors of description. Neither the auctioneers nor the vendor shall give any warranty to any purchaser or be liable for any fault or error of description or lack of genuineness or authenticity of any lot or item in any lot whether or not exhibited with any certificate of opinion or other supporting document or mark. (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this clause, if after the sale the purchaser of a lot shall prove it to be not genuine or not authentic or wrongly described the purchaser shall be at liberty to return the lot provided that he within 21 days of the date of the sale gives notice in writing to the auctioneers of intention to question as the case may be the genuineness or authenticity or description of the lot AND within 14 days after giving such notice (or in exceptional cases, such longer time as in the absolute discretion of the auctioneers they may in writing allow) returns to the auctioneers at their salesrooms the lot in the same condition as at the date of sale. The onus of proving a lot to be not genuine or not authentic or wrongly described shall lie with the purchaser. Proof of the inability of a recognised expert committee to express a definite opinion shall not discharge such onus. If a lot is sold with a certificate of opinion of a recognised expert committee that the lot is genuine or authentic, a subsequent certificate of such committee that the lot is not genuine or not authentic shall discharge such onus. In the case of conflict of opinion as to genuineness or authenticity or description the auctioneers shall have the right to rely on the opinion of an expert reasonably regarded by them to be a reliable authority. (c) If the purchaser of a lot shall discharge the onus in compliance with paragraph (b) of this clause the auctioneers shall rescind the sale and repay to the purchaser the purchase price paid by him. (d) Notwithstanding paragraph (c) of this clause no lot may be returned if subsequent to the sale it has been immersed in water or treated by any other process unless the auctioneers' permission to subject the lot to such immersion or treatment has first been obtained in writing. (e) A lot listed under "Collections and Various" or a lot stated to comprise or contain a collection, issues or undescribed stamps shall be put up for sale not subject to return and shall be taken by the purchaser with all (if any) faults, lack of genuineness and authenticity, and errors of description and number of stamps in the lot, and the purchaser shall have no right to return the lot.

7.—If a purchaser fails to comply with any condition of sale the damages recoverable by the auctioneers from him shall include any loss arising on, and the expenses of, resale.
