CONDITIONS OF SALE

Notice. Harmers of London Stamp Auctioneers Ltd., the auctioneers, exercise all reasonable care to ensure that all statements as to cancellation, centring, colour, condition, date of issue or of postal marking, gum, margins, paper, perforation, printing, provenance, quality, sheet position, status, usage, watermark, etc., in lot descriptions are reliable and accurate, and that each item is genuine unless contrary is indicated. However, the statements are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be, statements of fact or representations of fact in relation to the lot. They are statements of the opinion of the auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 5 below. Comments and opinions, concerning the characteristics mentioned above, which may be found in or on lots as notes, catalogue prices, writing-up or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of lot descriptions and are not to be taken as such unless they are made or specifically verified by the auctioneers.

1. (a) Each lot is put up subject to any reserve price imposed by the vendor.

(b) Subject to sub-clause (a) of this clause the highest bidder for each lot shall be the purchaser thereof.

(c) If any dispute arises as to the highest bidder the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute and may put up again and re-sell the lot in respect of which the dispute arises.

On 11 December 1907 the Crown Agents advised the printers that the Jamaica Government had decided to purchase duty plates for the Cayman Islands 3d. and 10/- values for use with the Old Universal key plate. In consequence, two days later, the printers submitted IMPERIUM 6d. trials for the 3d. (solid numeral) in purple on yellow and the 10/- (white numeral) in purple and blue on blue.

On 1 January 1908 the Crown Agents advised the printers that they must follow the new colour scheme and asked for transmission to the Colony, specimens of all the values on order printed in the colours selected by them, i.e. the Universal Colour Scheme for all Colonies.

On 6 January IMPERIUM 6d. trials were submitted for the 2½d. ultramarine, 3d. purple on yellow, 4d. grey and red on yellow, 1/-black on green, 5/-green and red on yellow, 10/-green and red on green. These were "Approved for values stated" by Sir William Mercer on the following day.

We were advised on 11 December 1907 that the Govt. of Jamaica had decided to purchase duty plates for 3d & 10/- values for use with the old Universal key plate. These specimen colours were accordingly submitted on Dec. 13th, but on 1st January 1908 the Crown Agents advised us that we must follow the new colour scheme, and asked for specimens of all the stamps on order printed in the colours selected by them i.e. the Universal Colour Scheme for all Colonies for transmission to the Colony.
