- postage, insurance and handling.

 5. Title shall not pass to the buyer until full payment has been received by Harmers.

 6. Buyers agree to pay for lots as specified above and no credit is extended; a late payment charge of 11/2% per month is added to overdue payments.

QUALITY AND AUTHENTICITY

- 7. Each lot is sold as genuine and correctly described based on individual description as modified by any specific notations in this catalogue including (but not restricted to) "Key to Cataloguing
 - (a) QUALITY. Any lot, description of which is incorrect, is returnable within two weeks of receipt and must be received by Harmers within four weeks from date of the auction. If the opinion of a mutually acceptable authority is desired, this period will be extended as noted in Condition 8. All disputed lots must be returned intact in the condition received. The following lots are not returnable except at the discretion of Harmers: lots from buyers who had the opportunity to examine them before the auction; stamps on account of appearance when they are illustrated in this catalogue.
 - (b) AUTHENTICITY. 

G PAID 30 JY 64 (earliest date known), black c.d.s. BOSTON MASS AUG 12 10, red 4 ms. marking. On reverse in ms. "Forwarded by James Thorrold St. Georges, Bermuda". There are numerous pencil comments such as "Uncle Jim, captured June 15, 1864 near Petersburg. Was pardoned and reached home Oct. 17", etc. Envelope somewhat damaged at edges. Est. Cash Val. \$2,500-5,000 (Photo)

The explanation of Sir Henry is:"

It is probable that this letter was carried from Wilmington to Bermuda by the North Heath. It is believed that the letter left Bermuda in a sealed bag for Halifax by Alpha Aug. 2nd, 1864 and was transferred on arrival to British barque Halifax arriving Boston on Aug. 11th and next day received the Boston "10" applied to letters received from foreign countries where no postal convention existed with the U.S.A. as in the case of Bermuda.

On the flap of the envelope it is noted that the letter was forwarded by James Thorrold St. Georges, Bermuda. Thorrold was the agent for Albion Trading Co. Ltd. which owned four blockade runners Emily, Minnie, Helen & North Heath. John Tory Bourne the Confederate commercial agent was appointed to work in conjuction with

Thorrold.

The "4" in manuscript represents the amount due G.P.O. London - another penny was collected for local postage, possibly.



Up to 1962 Ludington had not seen an example of this postmark (PM3) on cover. In his "Supplement" of 1968 he reports examples and suggests Ireland Island as the source. This letter relating to problems within the Methodist Church comes from a missionary of the Church, Theophilus Pugh . H.M.S. Andromache, with a Packet Mail, sailed from Ireland Isle 20 Nov. 1839 to England.
