NOTICE

The auctioneers exercise all reasonable care to ensure that all statements as to cancellation, centring, colour, condition, date of issue or of postal markings, gum, margins, paper, perforation, printing, provenance, quality, sheet position, status, usage, watermark, etc. in lot descriptions are reliable and accurate, and that each item is genuine unless the contrary is indicated. However, the statements are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be, statements of fact or representation of fact in relation to the lot. They are statements of the opinion of the auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 5 of the PHILATELIC AUCTIONEERS' STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE (1973 REVISION) set out below. Comments and opinions, concerning the characteristics mentioned above, which may be found in or on lots as notes, lists, catalogue prices, writing-up or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of lot descriptions and are not to be taken as such unless they are made or specifically verified by the auctioneers.

Clause 1

- (a) Each lot is put up subject to any reserve price imposed by the vendor.
- (b) Subject to sub-clause (a) of this clause, the highest bidder for each lot shall be the purchaser thereof.
- (c) If any dispute arises as to the highest bidder the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute and may put up again and re-sell the lot in respect of which the dispute arises.

Clause 2

- (a) The bidding and advances shall be regulated by and at the absolute discretion of the auctioneer and he shall have the right to refuse any bid or bids.
- NOTE: Where an agent bids, even on behalf of a disclosed client, the auctioneer nevertheless has the right at his discretion to refuse any such bid.
- (b) The purchaser of each lot shall immediately on its sale if required by the auctioneer to give him the name and address of the purchaser and pay to the auctioneer at his discretion the whole or part of the purchase money. 
Clause 4

- (a) Each lot shall be at the purchaser's risk from the fall of the hammer and shall be paid for in full before delivery and taken away at his expense by a purchaser in the United Kingdom within 7 days from the date of sale and by a purchaser overseas within 14 days from the date of sale or such longer time as shall be agreed in writing between the auctioneer and the purchaser.
- (b) If any purchaser fails to pay in full for any lot within the time stated in sub-clause (a) of this clause such lot may at any time thereafter at the auctioneer's discretion be put up for sale by auction again or sold privately; if upon such re-sale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and the expenses of re-sale which shall become debt due from him.
- (c) Interest shall be payable by the purchaser on any overdue account, but the auctioneer shall have a discretion to waive payment of the interest.

Clause 5

- (a) Each lot is sold as (i) genuine unless otherwise described in the sale catalogue or by the auctioneer, and (ii) correctly described. The date of any certificate forming part of the description of any lot will be included in the description.
- (b) A purchaser shall be at liberty to reject any lot if he (i) gives the auctioneer written notice of intention to question the genuineness or, as the case may be, the accuracy of description of the lot within 7 days (or, in the case of an overseas purchaser, a reasonable time) from the date of sale; AND (ii) proves that the lot is not genuine or was incorrectly described; AND (iii) returns to the auctioneer within 30 days from the date of the sale the lot in the same condition as it was at the time of sale; provided that the auctioneer may, at his discretion, on receiving a request in writing from the purchaser, extend for a reasonable period the time for return of the lot to enable it to be submitted to expertisation.

Dr. R. P. Towers MD, FRCPI, FRCPath., FFPathRCPI.

Dr. R. P. Towers is a native of Dublin, where he qualified in medicine. After training in Dublin and in the U.K. he was appointed a consultant pathologist to St. Vincent's Hospital, Dublin, from which he retired, as Head of Department, in 1992. During his career he served on many medical bodies and committees and was President of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland in its centenary year. He was the first Dean of the then newly formed Faculty of Pathology of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland in 1981.

His interest in the stamps goes back nearly 60 years. His collection of Grenada commenced some 30 years ago when a chance purchase of a number of the early issues enabled him, as he says, "to get a feel for" the various printings. It grew to encompass postal history, postal stationery and revenue stamps as well as traditional adhesive postage stamps. His first foray into competitive philately led to a bronze medal at London 1970, followed by a number of gold medals and vermeil at Stampa, the Irish National Exhibition. A return to the international scene saw Large Vermeil awards at Melbourne 1984, Stockholm 1986, Toronto 1987 and Wellington 1990, and culminated in a gold medal at London 1990.

In addition to Grenada, Dr. Towers admits to collecting the rest of the British Commonwealth but tries to keep quiet about it as he fears that so many people might see this as evidence of at least incipient insanity! However, his wife, who says she was jealous of his stamps in their earlier married life, is now happy that they occupy so much of his time and thoughts in retirement. "Leave him alone and he'll play for hours" is her motto.

As well as being a Fellow of the Royal Philatelic Society, London, Dr. Towers is also a member of the Irish Philatelic Society, of which he is a Past President, the Dublin Stamp Society, The British West Indies Study Circle and the British Caribbean Philatelic Study Group. He is a past Chairman of the Federation of Philatelic Societies of Ireland, a signatory of the Roll of Distinguished Philatelists of Ireland and served on the Philatelic Advisory Committee of the now-defunct Irish Department of Posts and Telegraphs.
