Estimates

The estimated selling price of each lot is printed beside the lot description and does not include the Buyer's Premium (or VAT, when this is payable on the hammer price, as indicated by the symbol * or **, see VAT). The estimates are prepared will in advance of the sale, are not definitive, and are subject to revision.

Buyer's Premium

A Buyer's Premium is payable at 15% on the first £30,000 of the hammer price of each lot purchased, plus 10% thereafter of the hammer price for that lot. For wine a buyer's premium is payable at 10% regardless of value. (VAT at the appropriate rate is charged on the premium).

Value Added Tax (* & **)

The Symbol * after a lot number indicates that VAT is payable by the purchaser, at the standard rate, on the hammer price. The double symbol ** after a lot number indicates that the lot has been imported from outside the European Union under HMCE Temporary Importation Regulations, and that VAT at an effective rate of 5% will be payable by the buyer on the hammer price and on the premium.

For lots which appear without either of the above symbols no VAT will be payable on the hammer price and the premium will be shown inclusive of VAT. The VAT inclusive with the premium is not normally recoverable by the buyer.

Note: There is no VAT payable on the hammer price, or on the premium, of Books bought at auction.

Ways of Bidding

In Person

Subject to which all lots are offered at this auction at which members of the public are present in person bidding against each other for themselves or as agents.

The Philatelic Auctioneers' Standard Terms and Conditions of Sale (1973 Revision) apply only to an auction sale which includes members of the public present in person bidding against each other for themselves or as agents.

The Philatelic Auctioneers' Standard Terms and Conditions of Sale (1973 Revision) do not apply to any "postal auction" at which "bids" consist exclusively of written or telephoned offers to buy at stated prices or limits and which does not include members of the public present in person bidding against each other for themselves or as agents.

Notice

The auctioneers exercise all reasonable care to ensure that all statements as to cancellation, centring, colour, condition, date of issue or of postal markings, gum, margins, paper, perforation, printing, provenance, quality, sheet position, status, usage, watermark, etc. in lot descriptions are reliable and accurate, and that each item is genuine unless the contrary is indicated. However, the statements are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be, statements of fact or representation of fact in relation to the lot. They are statements of the opinion of the auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 5 of the Philatelic Auctioneers' Standard Terms and Conditions of Sale (1973 Revision) set out below. Comments and opinions, concerning the characteristics mentioned above, which may be found in or on lots as notes, lists, catalogue prices, writing-up or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of lot descriptions and are not to be taken as such unless they are made or specifically verified by the auctioneers.

Clause 1

- (a) Each lot is put up subject to any reserve price imposed by the vendor.
- (b) Subject to sub-clause (a) of this clause, the highest bidder for each lot shall be the purchaser thereof.
- (c) If any dispute arises as to the highest bidder the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute and may put up again and resell the lot in respect of which the dispute arises.

Clause 2

- (a) The bidding and advances shall be regulated by and at the absolute discretion of the auctioneer and he shall have the right to refuse any bid or bids. Note: Where an agent bids, even on behalf of a disclosed client, the auctioneer nevertheless has the right at his discretion to refuse any such bid.
- (b) The purchaser of each lot shall immediately on its sale if required by the auctioneer to give him the name and address of the purchaser and pay to the auctioneer at his discretion the whole or part of the purchase money. If the purchaser of any lot fails to comply with any such requirement the auctioneer may put up again and re-sell the lot; if upon such resale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and expense of re-sale which shall become a debt due from him.
- (c) Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed client such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase money to the auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said client.

Clause 3

- (a) The auctioneer reserves the rights to bid on behalf of clients and vendors, but shall not be liable for errors or omissions in executing instructions to bid.
- (b) The auctioneer reserves the rights before or during a sale to group together lots belonging to the same vendor, to split up and to withdraw any lot or lots at the auctioneer's absolute discretion and without giving any reason in any case.
- (c) The auctioneer acts as agents only, and therefore shall not be liable for any default of the purchaser or vendor.

Clause 4

(a) Each lot shall be at the purchaser's risk from the fall of the hammer and shall be paid for in full before delivery and taken away at his expense by a purchaser in the United Kingdom within 7 days from the date of sale and by a purchaser overseas within 14 days from the date of sale or such longer time as shall be agreed in writing between the auctioneer and the purchaser.

- (b) If any purchaser fails to pay in full for any lot within the time stated in sub-clause (a) of this clause such lot may at any time thereafter at the auctioneer's discretion be put up for sale by auction again or sold privately; if upon such re-sale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and the expenses of re-sale which shall become debt due from him.
- (c) Interest shall be payable by the purchaser on any overdue account, but the auctioneer shall have a discretion to waive payment of the interest.

Clause 5

- (a) Each lot is sold as (i) genuine unless otherwise described in the sale catalogue or by the auctioneer. and (ii) correctly described. The date of any certificate forming part of the description of any lot will be included in the description.
- (b) A purchaser shall be at liberty to reject any lot if he -(i) gives the auctioneer written notice of intention to question the genuineness or, as the case may be, the accuracy of description of the lot within 7 days (or, in the case of an overseas purchaser, a reasonable time) from the date of sale; AND (ii) proves that the lot is not genuine or was incorrectly described; AND (iii) returns to the auctioneer within 30 days from the date of the sale the lot in the same condition as it was at the time of sale; provided that the auctioneer may, at his discretion, on receiving a request in writing from the purchaser, extend for a reasonable period the time for return of the lot to enable it to be submitted to

Note: The onus of proving a lot not to be genuine or incorrectly described is on the purchaser. The inability of a recognised expert committee to express a definite opinion shall serve to discharge the onus on

- the purchaser and shall be a ground for rejecting the lot concerned.
- (c) Where a lot has been submitted to expertisation, all costs of such expertisation shall be paid by the person who retains the certificate and item or items to which the certificate relates.
- (d) Where the purchaser of a lot discharges the onus and acts in accordance with sub-clause (b) of this clause, the auctioneer shall rescind the sale and repay to the purchaser the purchase money paid by him in respect of the lot.
- (e) No lot shall be rejected if, subsequent to the sale, it has been immersed in water, marked by an expert committee or treated by any other process unless the auctioneer's permission to subject the lot to such immersion or treatment has first been obtained in writing.



John Joshua (Jack) Challis



John Joshua (Jack) Challis' early interest in stamps was encouraged by his father, O. E. Challis, who was a pioneer in photography with the army in the Boer War and later with the navy, recording by photography the first trials of aircraft take-off from the modified ship, *Manxman*. His elder brother, Robert Challis worked at Turks Island in the British West Indies between the wars and after WWII. He was also interested in collecting and forwarded many inter-island and early covers from local sources. Thus a formative collection of not widely available items grew as a specialist interest, collecting over many years, culminating in research and then compiling and publishing a specialist book on the British West Indies stamps.

My Father was a keen yachtsman, so newly married to Mary and with the war approaching, he volunteered for the navy and became navigator in a corvette, *Sabre*, on Atlantic patrol, and later in a Mine Sweeper, *Lord Grey*, when posted to Ceylon. At the time of the Normandy landings he led a small flotilla of mine sweepers occupying the Western Approaches. After the end of hostilities, Dad returned to live in Southend on Sea, Essex, there sons John then Roger arrived and he returned to the Phoenix Insurance Company in London, rising to Chief Fire and Accident Surveyor before his retirement in 1976. With his wife Mary, he moved to Hoope Cove, a South Devon former fishing harbour, and continued with collecting, displays and welcoming visiting collectors. Watercolour painting and selling the pictures locally allowed Dad to continue his passion for his specialist collection by the purchase of elusive stamps and part collections.

As a child, I recall being asked to give a second opinion on an ever so slight shade of printing ink, or paper, or feature of an overprint, only to be told afterwards which was the scarce one, or that this variant was not catalogued. I later appreciated this expertise when a Stanley Gibbons catalogue included an acknowledgement to Dad's contribution. Also, in the evening Dad would lay out with a ruler, black ink and nib pen in his careful hand written script, for his collection and specialist exhibitions. Many friends would visit Dad for a chat over stamps, as he had a wide circle, who will, like my brother John and I, miss his amiability.

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
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
