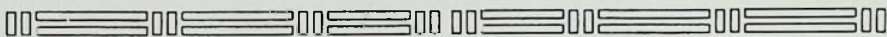

Introduction.



THE popularity of Artists' Drawings, Essays, Proofs and Specimen stamps has grown steadily with the increase in the number of collectors who desire the combination of rarity and beauty. Nevertheless, knowledge about the subject is often sketchy and the following brief notes may help collectors to appreciate the finer points between the various classes of material.

During the war years a society has been founded in the United States called "The Essay-Proof Society" to which many leading philatelists belong, and the comprehensive lists and articles appearing in their Journal are of exceptional interest to the connoisseur who appreciates such articles of virtue.

DEFINITIONS.

Artists' Drawings:—These comprise the original sketches in black and white or in colour from which the engraver prepared the die. During the last century these were normally the size of the stamps, but with the introduction of commercial photography one finds an artist's drawing of considerably larger size. Instances of the smaller drawings can be found in lots 257 and 357. It should be noted that reduced photographs (as in lot 356) of the larger drawings can be found stamp size. Each item under this heading is unique.

Essays:—This term applies to any design not adopted for issue, and it can be found in the form of a drawing (example lot 356), a composite essay made by pasting up part of printed design with a hand drawn design (example lot 60 — plate I), a die proof (example last stamp in plate II) or a plate proof, the latter imperforate or perforate, in black or in colour. Essays are sometimes very common, sometimes unique.

Engraver's Proofs:—These are impressions taken from the die by the engraver to see how his work is progressing — generally these are very rare.

Die Proofs:—These impressions have been taken from the die before it has been used to make the plate (in the case of line-engraved or surface-printed stamps) on the stone (in the case of lithographed stamps). In the case of line-engraved and lithographed stamps the die is usually engraved; in the case of surface-printed stamps the die is usually typographed.

Die proofs can be easily detected when in fine condition as the margins are normally larger than the space between each impression on the plate. Die proofs are normally single impressions on one piece of paper — (examples — all illustrations on plate III except the Cape 1/-), but there are a few exceptions. For those who are familiar with printing, a die proof with the margins removed may be easily identified by the impression. Die Proofs are sometimes common (reprints exist) but often are very rare. Master Die Proofs are usually without the value and sometimes without the name of the country.

Plate Proofs:—These are normally taken from the plate or stone before it is used for printing stamps. Normally these are much more common and rather less attractive than die proofs, but some are very rare.

Colour Trials:—These are proof impressions taken in various colours for the purpose of determining the colour of the issued stamp. They may be found in the form of die or plate proofs. Some are common but often they are of considerable rarity.

Colour Proofs:—These are Colour Trials but in the issued colour. The following notes on rarity may be of use:—

PERKINS, BACON & CO., PRINTINGS.

The classic (pre-1880) die proofs of this firm are normally printed in black on India paper mounted on card (see lots 78, 151 and 152 illustrated in plate III), sometimes on card and rarely on wove paper (see lot 334 in plate III).

Opinion seems to be divided between six and ten for the number printed in black from each die, in colour they are even more rare.

Between the years 1902 and 1929 this firm produced as souvenirs or samples of their work a number of reprints from original dies or from special plates (as lots 70 and 71) made by the original die. These are usually common and can normally be detected by the bright colours in which they are printed, the paper is normally thin wove or card (sometimes glazed and in colour) and many exist with the labels of value blank, defaced with acid or with etched lines. There are numerous examples but the only illustrated examples is lot 429 in plate III. Those of the later years are mostly very common (examples lots 190-193) but earlier reprints are often rare (example lot 429). Plate proofs in black of these issues are usually fairly common but in colour they are mostly very rare.

DE LA RUE PROOFS.

Die proofs in black printed by this firm are usually on glazed card. They are slightly less rare than those produced by Perkins, Bacon & Co., and, judging by personal experience, if six to ten copies exist of the latter, possibly twelve to twenty copies exist of the former.

All the die proofs in colour are extremely rare, and of those made from Perkins Bacon dies in the De La Rue (example the first type Trinidad 1d., 4d., 6d. and 1/- in the colour plate) probably only one or two copies exist.

Plate Proofs in black or in colour printed by this firm are much more unusual. One of the most unusual series of proofs in this sale are the imperforate colour trials on paper usually watermarked Crown CC (examples are lots 87, 117, 162 and 173 in the colour plate) — it is even possible that these were made from the dies. The only pair known to us is the Barbados ½d. (lot 156 in plate V) and it is possible that these were made from the bottom row of the plate.

Another series of considerable interest are the Queen Victoria key plate type without value expressed. These are found imperf. and perf. 12 and very few copies are known (example lot 461 on plate V).

EARLY SPECIMEN STAMPS.

Most of the early issues offered in this sale are of considerable interest and rarity since they belong to the period 1863-1882 at the commencement of which the stamps of certain Colonies which had previously been printed by Messrs Perkins Bacon, were now produced by Messrs. De La Rue, and most of these, together with the De La Rue issues which had previously been printed on unwatermarked paper, now made their appearance on new paper with the Crown CC watermark. Specimen copies of some of the first Colonial issues had already been distributed to Postmasters and Postal Authorities in what seems to have been a very haphazard manner, and distribution of "SPECIMEN" stamps to members of the U.P.U. was not to be put into operation until about 1885.

During this period there were few changes in colour or design and few new values were issued with the exception of those necessitated by the currency changes of Ceylon and Mauritius, so it is difficult to understand for what purpose these "SPECIMEN" stamps were produced.

Most of those in this sale, in particular those overprinted "SPECIMEN" in Nicholson's Type 8 and "CANCELLED" in his type 26 were included in a collection contained in an old volume inscribed "*Indian Stamped Papers*" which must obviously have come from some official source.

Features of considerable interest about this collection were that many sets included some values overprinted "SPECIMEN" and others with "CANCELLED", the choice being apparently quite indiscriminate, while a considerable proportion, both of the "SPECIMEN" and "CANCELLED" stamps, were imperforate proofs in the issued colours included in sets with the normal perforated stamps. Most of these proofs were identical with those contained in a very similar collection which came on the market in 1933, but in which all the stamps were overprinted "SPECIMEN" in quite a different type.

The "CANCELLED" stamps and imperforate proofs were without exception De La Rue printings while those overprinted "SPECIMEN" included also a few of the stamps produced by Messrs. Perkins Bacon, and Messrs. Bradbury Wilkinson, so it seems probable that both these collections, and other similar collections which may have been broken up in the past or which still exist to-day, were made up from copies supplied by some Central body, possibly the Colonial Office, from stocks of stamps which they held for specimen purposes and which included a number of imperforate examples.

Such little evidence as there is would seem to indicate that while "SPECIMEN" stamps issued before and after the period under review were normally supplied to Postmasters or Postal Authorities as samples of a new stamp (new in value, colour or design) about to be or recently issued, those made during this period (with which are closely associated stamps overprinted "CANCELLED") received a very limited distribution in the form of collections of all the stamps available to the issuing Authority at the date of supply, presumably for record or reference purposes.

DE LA RUE SAMPLES.

Proof impressions of certain values of the King George V Colonial Stamps of about 1920-21 printed in unissued colours exist in considerable numbers.

In general the most attractive designs were chosen and very clear printings were made on unwatermarked gummed paper or on thin card both imperforate and perforate (rare). These proofs are mostly overprinted "SPECIMEN" in a variety of types, but a few also exist without this overprint (scarce). It is believed that they were originally contained in books prepared by the printers as samples of their work, and that a few issued stamps of this period overprinted "CANCELLED" also belong to this category.

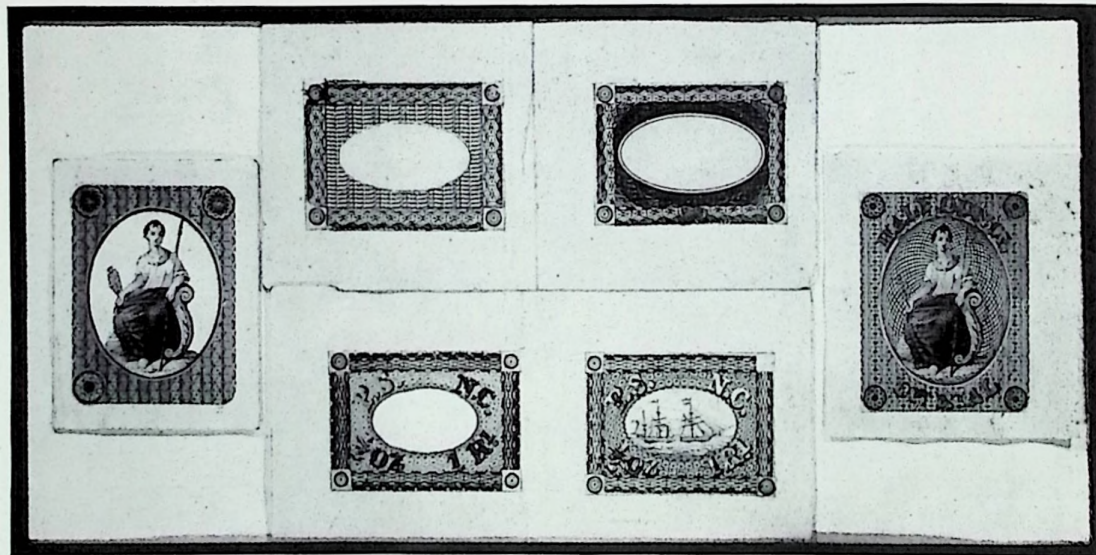

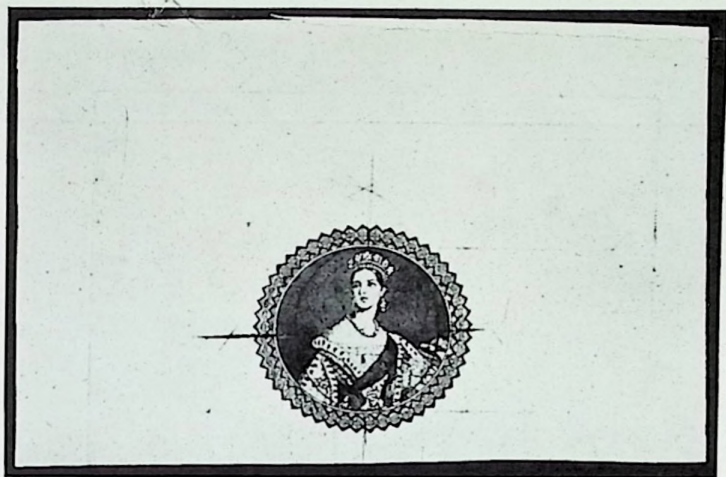

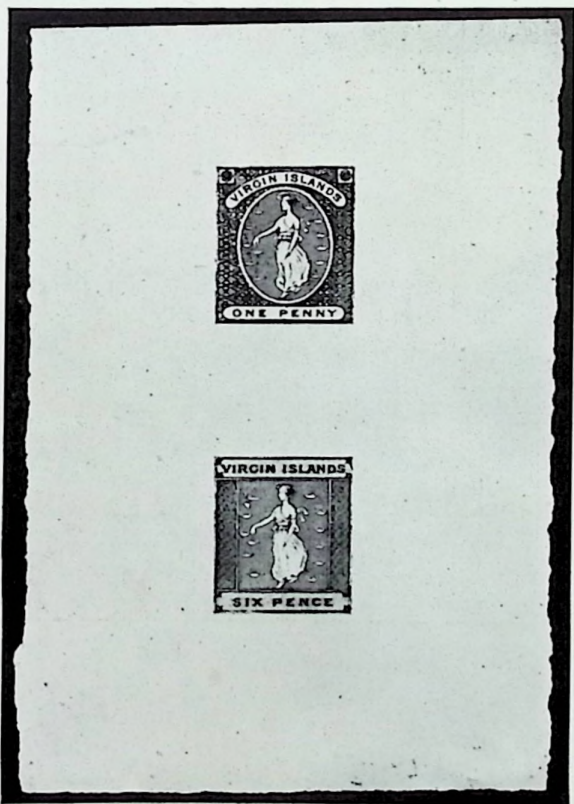
