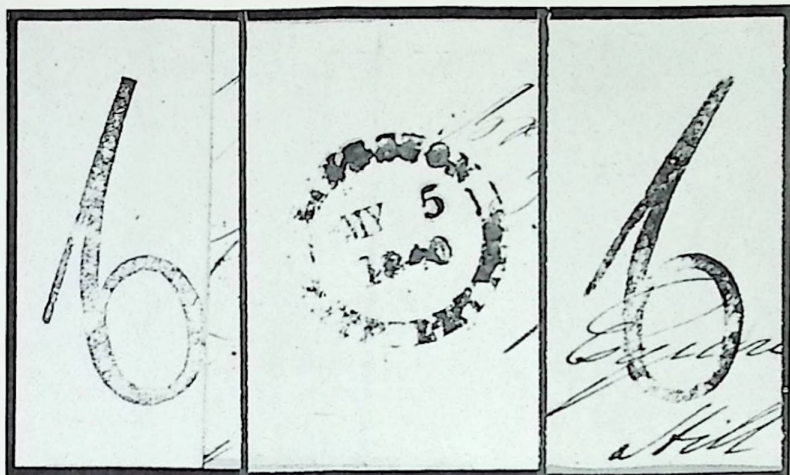

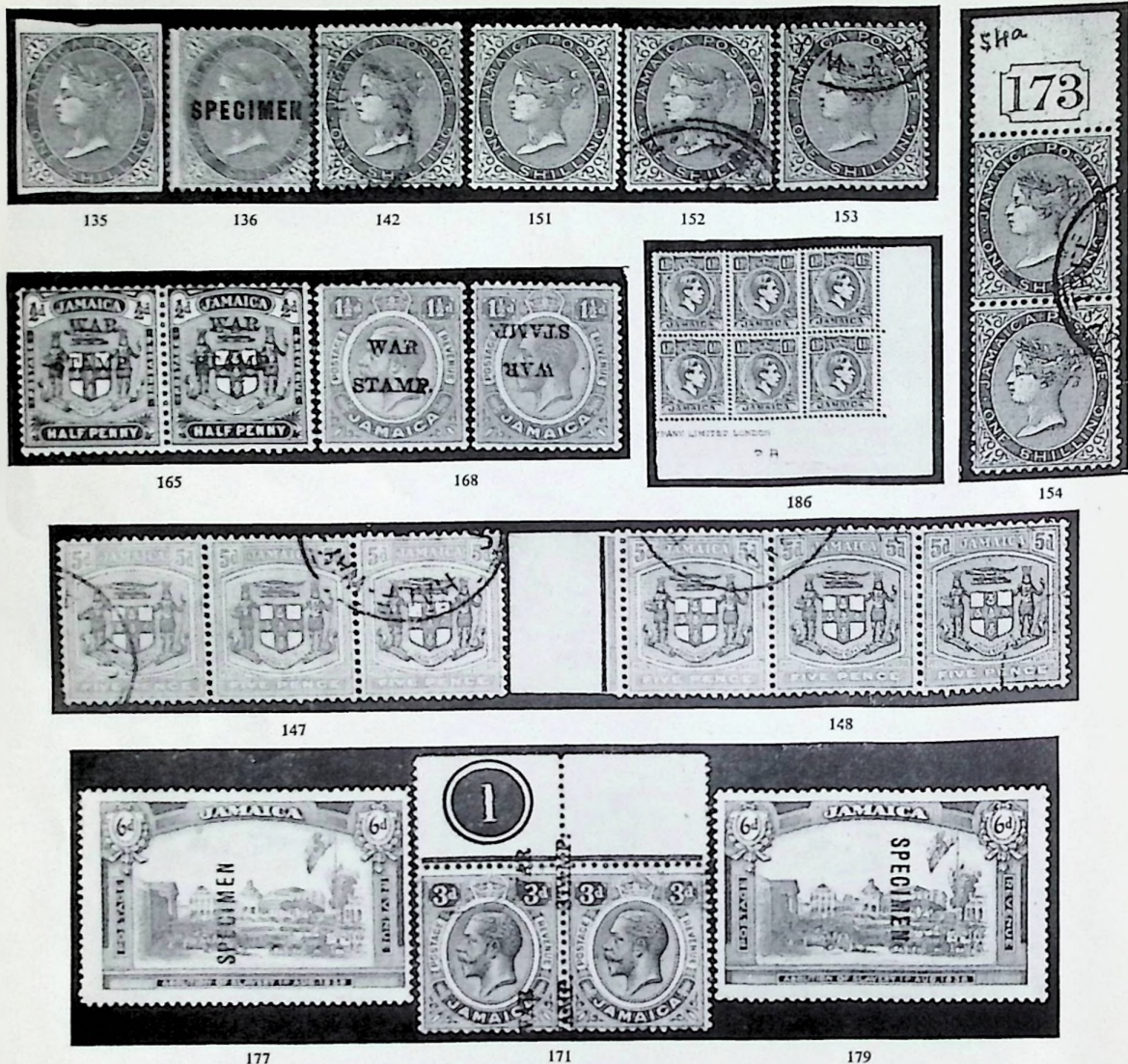

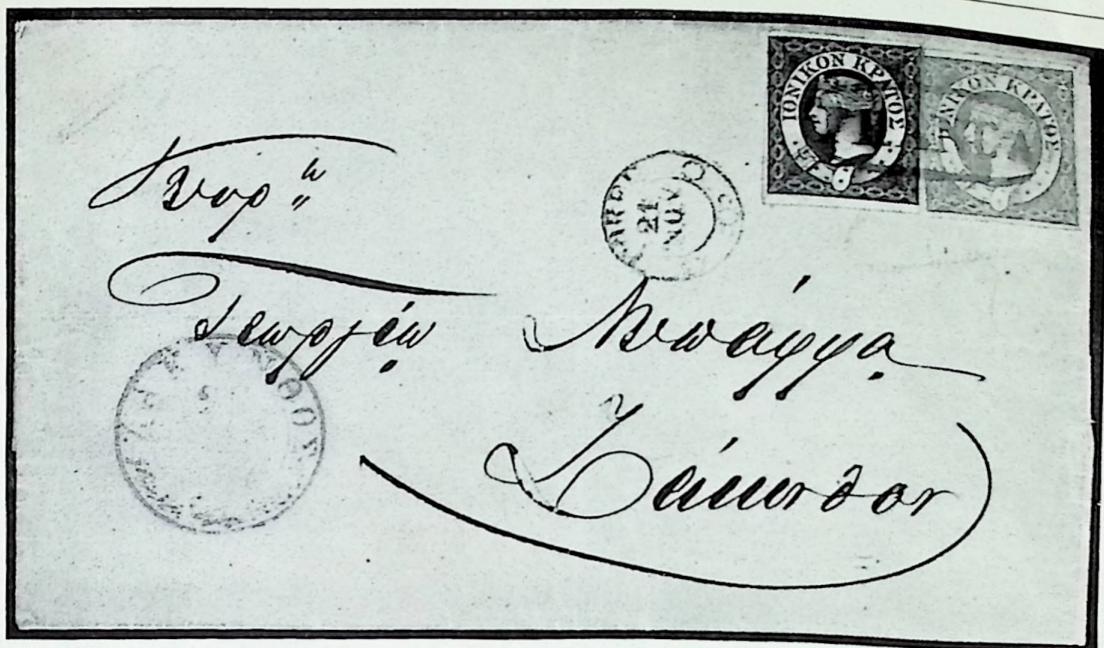

Pakistan Overprints

THIS REMARKABLE COLLECTION, which is housed in seven volumes, was formed by Colonel D. R. Martin, the leading authority on this subject, whose work has resulted in a record which will shortly be appearing in print.

When India and Pakistan attained their independence, Colonel Martin was fortunately in the right place. He concentrated on obtaining used copies, often in large blocks, and acquired a wealth of entires and pieces bearing both the hand-stamped and typed overprints. In the Government machine-printed overprints most values are shown unused with many varieties and a considerable quantity of plating material.

The handstamped and typed overprints from some of the smaller places are quite unrivalled and all other sections are extremely well represented with a high proportion of rarities. For example, the collection contains all the known King George V 15 rupees and 25 rupees values and three of the Peshawar "SERVICE" overprints in red.

The collection contains 829 different of the 1,095 stamps separately listed in Colonel Martin's handbook. About ninety of the stamps are believed to be unique; and of more than a hundred others, probably only one other piece is known.

In all there are over 4,700 overprinted adhesives (and over a hundred pieces of postal stationery) listed at £2,680, these prices being based on the ruling retail figures in London in 1957. There are many varieties which are not priced in the handbook and have been taken in the estimate at normal rates.

It must be remembered that the local overprints of 1947-48 are only a small proportion of the stamps used in Pakistan during some eighteen months and that few, if any, of the handstamps — except Lahore "SERVICE" — were in use for over six months, and many for only a few weeks.
