The abbreviation "c.d.s." indicates circular date-stamp and "S.T.O." for Stamped to order.

The number in brackets at the end of each description is the number of stamps (or items) in the lot. (Approximate counts are indicated by \ddagger).

Extensions

Extensions should be requested at the time of making a bid. Buyers should complete the special form provided and return it to the Auctioneer who will then re-examine the lot. If it is established that the lot would not obtain a satisfactory certificate the sale of the lot will be cancelled forthwith and the expense and delay of submission to an Expert or Expert Committee avoided. If the re-examination is favourable lots will be delivered to inland purchasers who will be responsible for obtaining the expert opinion; lots purchased by overseas buyers will be submitted on their behalf to an Expert Committee. In no case will extensions be given for "Royal", B.P.A. or other acceptable expert opinions that necessitate more than two months delay from the date of the sale. Should the buyer (or ourselves on behalf of an overseas buyer) fail to secure such opinion within sixty days, the right to return the lot will be forfeited. The only exception is when the permission of the vendor for a longer extension has been obtained prior to the sale. All costs connected with expert opinions are the liability of buyers. When buyers wish to have an extension for a second opinion, such a bid can only be accepted on the understanding that the second opinion is obtained within sixty days of the auction. Value Added Tax and Stamp Sales

Postage stamps are Taxable Items and the following notes may help you to clarify the position.

How Value Added Tax affects:----

- The Vendor. All inland vendors must pay VAT at 10% on the amount of commission charged by the auctioneer. Overseas vendors do not pay VAT.
- 2. The Buyer. All inland buyers must pay VAT at 10% on their purchases of Taxable Lots (i.e. those marked "T" following the lot number in our catalogues).

Overseas buyers will not be charged VAT on purchases exported by the auctioneer (i.e. posted direct to an overseas address, including the Channel Islands).

Taxable Lots

Taxable lots are those offered on behalf of:---

- 1) Inland Registered Traders
- 2) Overseas Vendors

Non Taxable Lots

Non Taxable lots are those offered on behalf of inland private persons (collectors) and unregistered inland traders.

Imported Properties

All collections and items sent from overseas for sale are subject to VAT on sale. No tax falls upon the owner, it is only the inland buyer who bears the burden. For the purposes of VAT items sent from the Channel Islands are "imports" and therefore taxable items.

"Antiques"

Stamps 100 years old or more are eligible as antiques; therefore any sale will be invoiced at the purchase price on a Tax Inclusive basis. The vendor (if an inland resident), is of course liable to VAT on the commission.

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
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
