CONDITIONS OF SALE (September 1974)

NOTICE. Robson Lowe Ltd., the Auctioneers, exercise the utmost care to ensure that all statements as to cancellation, centring, colour. condition, date of issue or of postal marking, gum, margins, paper, perforation, printing, provenance, quality, sheet position, status, usage and watermark, etc., in the lot descriptions are reliable and accurate and that each item, unless the contrary is indicated, is genuine and authentic. The statements, however, are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be statements of fact or representations of fact. They are statements of the opinion of the Auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 6 of the Philatelic Auctioneers' Standard Terms and Conditions of Sale below. Unless made by Robson Lowe Ltd. comments and opinions concerning the points previously mentioned which may be found in or on lots in the form of notes, lists, writing-up or any other means of expression, do not constitute a part of the lot description and are not to be taken as such.

- 1. The purchaser to be the highest bidder. Any dispute arising as to the highest bidder to be determined by the Auctioneer who may re-offer any disputed lot.
- 2. (a) The bidding and advances to be regulated at the Auctioneer's discretion.
 - (b) If so required, buyers to give their names and addresses and/or to pay down the whole or part of the purchase price at the sale. Failure to comply with these rules in respect of any lot entitles the Auctioneer to re-sell the lot, any deficiency being made good by the defaulter.
 - (c) Agents bidding on behalf of undisclosed clients do so on their own responsibility both for payment and safe delivery of the lots.
- The Auctioneer reserves the right to bid on behalf of Clients and Vendors, but shall not be liable for any errors or omissions in executing instructions to bid.
- 4. The buyer of each lot to be responsible for it from the time it is "knocked down". Payment to be made in full before delivery and the lot to be removed by United Kingdom buyers within seven days and by Overseas buyers within a reasonable time. Failure to pay in full within such period entitles the Auctioneer to re-sell the lot, any deficiency being made good by the defaulter.
- 5. The Auctioneer shall not be liable for any default of the Purchaser or Vendor.
- 6. (a) Each lot is sold as genuine and correctly described.
 - (b) The purchaser to be at liberty to reject the lot by giving written notice within seven days (or, in the case of Overseas buyers, within a reasonable time of the date of the sale) if he proves that the lot is not genuine or is incorrectly described and returns the lot within thirty days of the sale (or within such longer period as the Auctioneer may at his discretion allow). The onus of proving a lot to be not genuine or wrongly described lies with the purchaser; proof of the inability of an Expert Committee to express a definite opinion will not discharge this onus.
 - (c) No lot to be rejected if, subsequent to the sale, it has been immersed in water or treated by any other process unless the Auctioneer's permission to subject the lot to such immersion or treatment has first been obtained.
 - (d) The above provisions of this clause do not apply to mixed lots and collections containing undescribed stamps.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- Failure on the part of a bidder or purchaser to comply with the conditions, a synopsis of which is
 printed above, entitles the Auctioneer to cause the bidder or purchaser to forfeit any deposit held.
 Any uncleared lots after seven days may be re-sold by public or private sale and any deficiency shall be
 made good by the defaulters.
- Lots purchased on behalf of mail bidders will be forwarded by the most practical method at the risk of the purchaser who shall bear all charges incurred.
- The Auctioneer shall not be liable for any omission or errors made by clients when sending their instructions to bid.

4. If a prospective purchaser wishes to obtain an expert opinion on any lot (not being a mixed lot or collection containing undescribed stamps) the Auctioneer must receive, in writing, any request for an 'extension' at least twenty-four hours prior to the time of the auction. The Auctioneer reserves the right on behalf of the vendor to cancel any bid with an extension (notifying the bidder) where it is established, by the Auctioneer, that the lot would not obtain a satisfactory certificate. Extensions for reasons of condition will not be granted for expert opinion, such matters being decided, prior to the sale, by the Auctioneer, who reserves the right to cancel the bid on behalf of the vendor and notify the bidder of his action.

Should the Auctioneer agree to accept a bid with an extension, this fact will be stated by the Auctioneer from the rostrum before the lot is offered for sale.

When a lot is sold subject to an extension, the Auctioneer will require the lot to be paid for pending the receipt of the expert opinion, the costs of which are the liability of the buyer.

Extensions are not given on mixed lots or a collection containing undescribed stamps or on an item which is already accompanied by a certificate of opinion dated within ten years of the day of the sale.

An extension can only be granted on the understanding that the opinion of the expert or expert committee is secured and the Auctioneer advised within 60 days of the date of the sale.

- 5. The right to refuse admission to the Auction Room is reserved.
- Bids from minors will not be accepted unless accompanied by a full cash deposit or by suitable guarantces. New clients must send references in advance or a full cash deposit.
- 7. All purchases made by residents in the Dollar Area must be paid for in Dollars at the controlled rate of exchange or by Sterling Draft.
- 8. Interest at 1% for the first month or part of a month and 1½% per month for any further credit, is charged on all auction accounts if payment is not made within seven days of the date of the Sale (Overseas Buyers within seven days of the receipt of the invoice). When paying in any currency other than sterling, 1% must be added to the account to allow for bank transfer costs.
- Stamps described as having defects are not returnable on account of their condition. Stamps cannot be returned on account of the centring or the amount of margin when such stamps are illustrated.
- 10. Any dispute as to the meaning or operation of these Special Conditions or of the Conditions, a synopsis of which is printed above, shall be determined conclusively by the Auctioneer.

Lots of a suitable size can be sent through the post for inspection, postage and insurance both ways to be borne by the client.

FRAGILE LOTS: In the interest of vendors, where any lot is, in our opinion, of a fragile nature we regret it will not be available on postal inspection.

Clients who cannot conveniently visit the auction rooms at 50 Pall Mall on the viewing days quoted, may view the lots at an earlier date by making an appointment, either by letter or telephone, giving three days' notice, and the time and lots required.

By observing these arrangements it makes it possible for the Inspection Clerk to reserve the lots required (which might otherwise be with a postal viewer) and to have them available on the mezzanine floor when the clients call.

With regard to new clients who request lots for postal viewing, references should be sent in advance.

Catalogue values and numbers are those of the latest available Gibbons (£), Scott (\$), Michel (DM), Yvert (FF), or Bolaffi (L). The use of Gibbons Specialised catalogue in Great Britain sales is clearly indicated. Where other catalogues are used they are mentioned by name. The abbreviation "c.d.s." indicates circular date-stamp and "S.T.O." for Stamped to order.

The number in brackets at the end of each description is the number of stamps (or items) in the lot. (Approximate counts are indicated by \$\$).

Extensions

Notice of any extension must be given in writing to the auctioneer at least twentyfour hours prior to the time of the auction. This notice must give the reason why an extension is required and whose expert opinion is to be sought; this latter must be agreed by the auctioneer. Extensions for reasons of genuineness and classification will be considered by the auctioneer who will examine the lot. If it is established that the lot would not obtain a satisfactory certificate, the bid and the extension will be cancelled and the bidder advised. Extensions requested for reason of condition will not normally be accepted for expert opinions to be secured, but the lot will be examined by the auctioneer and the bid cancelled if it is felt that a defect is present and not described. Lots described as 'with faults', 'defective' etc. are not subject to return on grounds of condition.

Any extension granted is so granted only on the understanding that the expert opinion is obtained within sixty days of the auction, after which time the right of return is forfeit. ANY VARIATION in this condition must be agreed in writing through the auctioneer prior to the auction between the potential buyer and the vendor. All lots on which an extension is granted must be paid for within seven days of the auction.
