NOTICE. The statements, however, are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be statements of fact or representations of fact. They are statements of the opinion of the Auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 6 of the Philatelic Auctioneers' Standard Terms and Conditions of Sale below. Unless made by Robson Lowe Ltd. comments and opinions concerning the points previously mentioned which may be found in or on lots in the form of notes, lists, writing-up or any other means of expression, do not constitute a part of the lot description and are not to be taken as such.

1. The purchaser to be the highest bidder. Any dispute arising as to the highest bidder to be determined

by the Auctioneer who may re-offer any disputed lot.
