CONDITIONS OF SALE

ALL BIDS SHALL BE TREATED AS OFFERS MADE UPON THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. Robson Lowe Limited ("Robson Lowe") act in all respects, save where otherwise appears, only as agents for the Seller of each lot and shall not be liable for any default of the Buyer or Seller.
2. The highest bidder acceptable to the Auctioneer shall be the Buyer but if, during or immediately after the sale of the lot, the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen or that there are other reasons for so doing, he may at his absolute discretion immediately put up the lot again for sale.
3. (a) The Auctioneer has the right at his absolute discretion to refuse any bid and to advance and regulate the bidding as he may decide.
(b) Robson Lowe have the right at their absolute discretion to withdraw or divide any lot or to combine any two or more lots.
(c) The Seller shall be entitled to place a reserve on any lot, and the Auctioneer or the Auctioneer's agent shall have the right to bid on behalf of the Seller for any lot on which a reserve has been placed.
4. (a) The purchase price payable by the Buyer shall be the aggregate of the final bid and a premium of 8% of the final bid (together with any V.A.T. chargeable on the final bid and such premium). "The final bid" shall mean the price at which a lot is knocked down to the Buyer.
(b) The Buyer shall forthwith supply his name and address and if so required by Robson Lowe his bank or other suitable references. The Buyer may be required to pay forthwith the whole or any part of the purchase price and if he fails to do so the lot or lots may at the Auctioneer's absolute discretion be put up again and resold, any deficiency in the purchase price attending such resale to be made good by the defaulting Buyer and any surplus (after retention by Robson Lowe of the premium) to be the Seller's.
(c) Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed principal such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase price to the Auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said principal.
5. (a) No lot may be taken away during the auction, nor may any lot be taken away until the purchase price has been paid in full.
(b) Each lot must be paid for in full before delivery and must be taken away at his expense by a United Kingdom Buyer within seven days of the date of the sale and by an overseas Buyer within a reasonable time, not exceeding 21 days.
(c) If the Buyer fails to pay for any lot in accordance with Condition 5 (b), Robson Lowe shall be entitled, at their absolute discretion:—
 - (i) without notice to the Buyer to resell the lot or cause it to be resold by public or private sale. Any deficiency in the purchase price attending such resale after crediting any part payment and after deducting full costs incurred in connection with the lot to be made good by the defaulting Buyer and any surplus, (after retention by Robson Lowe of the premium) to be the Seller's.
 - (ii) to charge interest at 2% per month, or part of a month, on the amount due.
- (d) The property in a lot shall not pass to the Buyer until he has paid the purchase price and any other charges in full but the lot shall be at the Buyer's risk in all respects from the fall of the hammer. Notwithstanding that Robson Lowe act only as agents for the Seller, they shall be entitled to retain the premium referred to in Condition 4. (a) hereof, irrespective of and in addition to such remuneration as they may receive from the Seller. Robson Lowe shall be entitled to a lien on any lot sold until the purchase price is paid in full by the Buyer.
6. (a) (i) All descriptions of lots in the catalogue and statements as to the genuineness of lots are statements of the opinion of Robson Lowe and are not nor are they to be taken to be statements or representations of fact. Estimates are the approximate prices expected by Robson Lowe to be realised and are not definitive. Estimates are made long in advance of the sale and may be revised by Robson Lowe.
(ii) Unless made by Robson Lowe, comments and opinions concerning the description or genuineness of any lot which may be found in or on lots in the form of notes, lists, writing up or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of the lot description and are not to be taken as such.
(iii) illustrations in the catalogue, advertisements or brochures of forthcoming sales are an integral part of the description and lots cannot be rejected pursuant to the following provisions of this Clause on account of any defect in their condition mentioned in the description or apparent from any such illustration.
- (b) (i) Notwithstanding (a) (i) above each lot (other than a mixed lot or lot containing undescribed stamps) is sold as genuine (unless otherwise described in the catalogue or by the Auctioneer) and correctly described; if the Buyer has paid the purchase price in full for any such lot and either has given notice pursuant to paragraph 4 of the Notice in the Catalogue ("Extensions") such notice having been accepted by Robson Lowe or gives written notice to Robson Lowe within seven days (or in the case of an overseas Buyer fourteen days) after the date of sale of his intention to question the genuineness or as the case may be the correctness of the description of such lot and, in respect of any such lot which has been taken away, returns the lot to Robson Lowe within thirty days from the date of sale in the same condition as at the time of the sale and proves within ninety days of the date of the sale that such lot is not genuine or was not correctly described then, provided the lot has not subsequent to the sale been marked, immersed in water or treated by any other process whatsoever without the prior written consent of Robson Lowe to such marking, immersion or treatment, the sale of the lot will be rescinded and any purchase price will be repaid to the Buyer.
(ii) The onus and cost of proving a lot to be not genuine or incorrectly described is on the Buyer: proof of the inability of an expert committee to express a definite opinion will discharge this onus.
(iii) Robson Lowe may at its discretion on receiving a request in writing from the Buyer extend for a reasonable period of time for return of the lot under (i) above to enable it to be submitted to an expert or expert committee.
- (c) Neither the Seller nor Robson Lowe nor any person in their employ, make or have any authority to make any representation or warranty, nor are they responsible for any representation or warranty or for any statement in the catalogues, or advertisements or brochures of forthcoming sales or illustrations therein.
7. (a) Robson Lowe shall not be liable for any omission or errors made by clients when sending their instructions to bid by post.
(b) Lots purchased by mail bidders will be forwarded by the most practical method at the risk of the Buyer who shall bear all charges incurred.
8. (a) Robson Lowe reserve the right to refuse admission to the Auction Room.

1. Conditions of Sale

All sales take place on the Conditions of Sale printed on the inside front cover.

2. Descriptions

Robson Lowe Limited exercises all reasonable care to ensure that the description of each lot and any statements as to the genuineness or condition of each lot are reliable and accurate. The descriptions and any such statements are, however, opinions only and your attention is drawn particularly to Clause 6 of the Conditions of Sale. Such information is given for guidance only and should be confirmed by examination prior to the sale. Certain terms and symbols are used in the catalogue for your guidance with the meanings ascribed to them below.

Catalogue values and numbers are those taken from the latest available Gibbons (£), Scott (\$), Michel (DM), Yvert (F.F.), Sassone (Lire), Facit (S.Kr.), Vlastos (Dr.), Zumstein (S.F.) or N.V.P.H. (gld.). The use of Gibbons Specialised catalogues in Great Britain sales is clearly indicated. Where other catalogues are used they are mentioned by name. The abbreviation "c.d.s." indicates circular date-stamp.

The number in brackets at the end of each description is the number of stamps (or items) in the lot. (Approximate counts are indicated by ‡).

3. V.A.T.

Buyers resident in the United Kingdom or taking delivery of lots at the auction will be liable to pay V.A.T. at the standard rate on those marked with the symbol "T" in the catalogue. Overseas buyers are exempt from paying V.A.T. if the lots are posted to an address outside the U.K. All buyers will be liable to pay V.A.T. on the premium.

4. Extensions

Prospective buyers who wish to obtain an expert opinion on any lot (other than a mixed lot or lot containing undescribed stamps) are requested to notify Robson Lowe Limited in writing not less than twenty-four hours before the time fixed for the commencement of the first session of the sale. If accepted by Robson Lowe Limited, such request shall have the same effect as notice of an intention to question the genuineness or description of the lot within seven (or fourteen as the case may be) days after the sale for the purposes of Clause 6(b) (i) of the Conditions of Sale; Clause 6 shall thereafter apply accordingly.

Notice of a request for an expert opinion must give the reason why such is required and specify the identity of the expert which will be subject to the agreement of Robson Lowe Limited.
